Honoring Disability Awareness Month

July marks National Disability Pride Month, a time to celebrate the signing of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) on July 26, 1990. This month-long observance goes beyond commemoration, serving as a powerful call to amplify the voices of people with disabilities and champion their rights and dignity.

People with disabilities face a much higher likelihood of becoming unhoused due to inaccessible workplaces, discriminatory hiring, and high healthcare costs. Cuts to social contract systems, like Medicaid and SNAP, worsen the issue. **Nearly half of DBIP** participants (49.3%) reported having a disability, and the unconditional cash transfers enabled participants to cover essentials, promoting independence and stability by trusting individuals to prioritize their needs. Guaranteed income is a powerful tool to help people with disabilities not only survive, but thrive.

New research reveals AI impact on workforce

A new <u>report</u> from the U.S. National Science Foundation and the Gerald Huff Fund for Humanity reveals the level of job disruption AI will have on various industries. According to the report, "This study is meant to serve as a bridge between our current understanding of AI's immediate impact on workers and policymakers' urgent need to develop programs addressing the future waves of AI disruption." Here are some overall findings from the report:

- Al is expected to disrupt approximately 25% of all jobs across all industries and occupations over the next 3 years.
- The top five most disrupted industries by AI include:
 - Wholesale Trade
 - Retail Trade
 - Finance and Insurance
 - Educational Services
 - ○Real Estate and Rental and Leasing
